### **Cultivating an Active Civil Society**

Created to be a lasting, independent institution, the Afghan Institute for Civil Society (AICS) is fostering an enabling environment for local Afghan organizations. Aga Khan Foundation, in partnership with Counterpart International and the US Agency for International Development, established AICS to help build local leadership, strengthen the capacity of civil society organizations, and support policy dialogue. Aga Khan Foundation supports AICS as it establishes a process for certifying qualified NGOs. The Board of Directors brings unique experience including Board Chair Dr. Habiba Sarabi, the country's first Afghan woman governor and a strong advocate for pluralism. At its inaugural ceremony in February, His Excellency Dr. Abdullah Abdullah, Chief Executive of the Afghan National Unity Government, presided as the country's top leaders and a broad range of organizations and media participated (see above photo).

# Making Long-term Investments to Improve Inclusive Financial Access

On July 10, the US Agency for International Development (USAID) approved a loan of \$1 million, via Aga Khan Foundation's mission-related investment portfolio, to the First MicroFinance Bank of Tajikistan as part of the Economic and Social Connections: Multi-Input Area Development for Tajikistan Global Development Alliance. These funds will help grow enterprises, create jobs and expand trade. Combined with a \$1 million loan from Aga Khan Foundation USA, this marks the first-ever joint investment made under a partnership between USAID and the Aga Khan Development Network.

### **Building Permanent Institutions**

The Overseas Private Investment Corporation (OPIC) has committed financing for the construction of the first phase of the University of Central Asia's (UCA) Khorog campus in Tajikistan. OPIC will finance \$30 million, alongside a \$64.4 million contribution from the Aga Khan Development Network (AKDN), including \$7.5 million from the Aga Khan Foundation USA, for its second undergraduate residential campus. This investment builds upon the progress of Phase I of UCA's Naryn campus in the Kyrgyz Republic, funded by the AKDN, and scheduled to open and admit the first student cohort in September 2016.

UCA is introducing a new standard of quality education in the region and will have three campuses in Central Asia in Tajikistan, Kyrgyz Republic and Kazakhstan. The campuses are an important step in strengthening access to quality education for the people of Central Asia, and allowing them to realize their potential and drive change in their communities, propelling economic growth for the region.

This is OPIC's second loan agreement with the Aga Khan Development Network; in 2013 they assisted with financing to the Aga Khan Hospital and Medical College Foundation for the expansion of healthcare facilities in Karachi, Pakistan.
